The European Court of Human Rights




is a place where judges make sure

A right is what you can and cannot do.




The judges say the **autistic boy** has to go to a **school for autistic people**.

The name of our campaign in 2019 is "A New Dynamic for autism."






A **campaign** is a number of activities that help give people a **message**.



The **message** we want to give people is that we must **understand** autism better and **respect** autistic people.




We want people to know about **autism** and our **congress**.

La Spezia is a city in Italy.




Italy is a country in Europe.








More than **50 members** came to the meeting in the city of La Spezia.

The members at the meetings talked about the things **Autism-Europe will do** in the future.




Members also talked about the campaign of Autism-Europe.

Then the members also went to a **place** where autistic people learn **how to work.**




The name of this place is Luna Blue.

A **restaurant** is a place where people can go to eat and drink.




The food and drinks are brought by **autistic people**.



On 3 May, Luna Blue opened.








Aurelie Baranger was there when Luna Blue opened.
