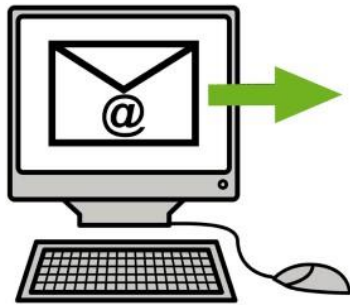

We have a campaign about making society inclusive autistic people.











This campaign has 5 goals.



We want all people to understand autism better.

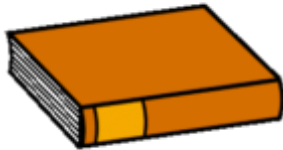
	<p>We want autistic people to have the right to make their own decisions.</p>

	<p>A photo exhibition is where artists show their pictures.</p>

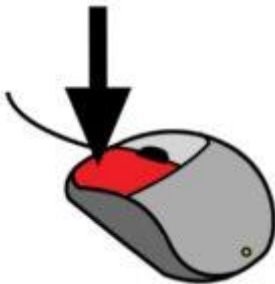
	<p>The European Parliament is an important political forum.</p>

	<p>The 25 pictures help people understand autism.</p>



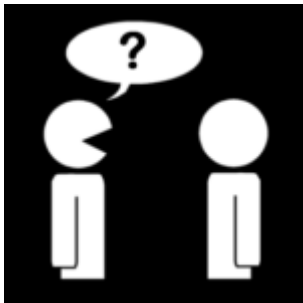
The pictures show life stories of autistic people.
